
**Project 1: Illuminated Letters** 

#### Illuminated Letters: Project Outline

The creative brief for this project was to create cover for a classic novel using only the first initial of the authors last name. The stipulations were that it could be in any style, by only one letter could be used. To the left are multiple examples of such a project.

The project chosen by this artist was Jack London's Call of the Wild; a story of survival of both man and dog based around the gold rush in the frigid Yukon Territory.






#### Illuminated Letters: Initial Sketches



None of these ideas would carry over.




### **Illuminated Letters:** Explorations


#### Illuminated Letters: Idea Refinement


#### Illuminated Letters: Rough Sketches


## Illuminated Letters: Computer Roughs

The next step involved designing the base letter in Adobe Illustrator, then printing it out and sketching on the prints. These were the best results of the rough layouts.




## Illuminated Letters: Computer, Refined


#### Illuminated Letters: Finished Product

Here is the illustration in the finished state. The appearance of the letter is much more graphic in nature that the initial sketches, but still express the idea of the story. The silver fade was chosen to portray the cold and harshness of the environment. The men marching up the hill with their supplies on their backs was inspired by a famous photograph taken during the Yukon Gold Rush. The dog poking around the tree gives the idea of a wild animal, looking over his shoulder at the call that keeps becoming his home. The call of his ancestors. The Call of the Wild.






